PAPER: PREPARATION OF FIELD BASED RESEARCH PROPOSAL: 10300 Marks: 40/60 (4 Credit)

The prime objectives are -to expose the research students to the field situation thereby test their theoretical learning of Research Methodology and secondly- to find out their ability /aptitude to undertake Ph.D. Research Work independently.

In this paper a student shall have to work on areas delineated below:

- 1. Selection of Research Topic with its Universe; significance & purpose and Field of study and Methodology;
- 2. Review of literature on the selected area and topic of research;
- 3. Pilot study to be undertaken in the proposed field of study before preparation of Research proposal (synopsis);
- 4. Prepare a Synopsis on the propose Topic of Research by following /including all the steps and elements necessary for a good research proposal;
- 5. Two copies of Reports have to be submitted for evaluation;
- 6. Presentation of Research Proposal: presenting the synopsis in at least two seminars, one at initial stage and another after completion before submission.

N.B.: End semester marks (Total of 70 marks) shall be awarded on the basis of evaluation (standard/quality) of submitted Research Proposal. In -Semester marks (Total =30 marks) shall be awarded on the basis of performance of 2 (two) Seminar presentations (10+10+=20) and also on viva-voce examination for 10 marks be conducted on submitted proposal.
